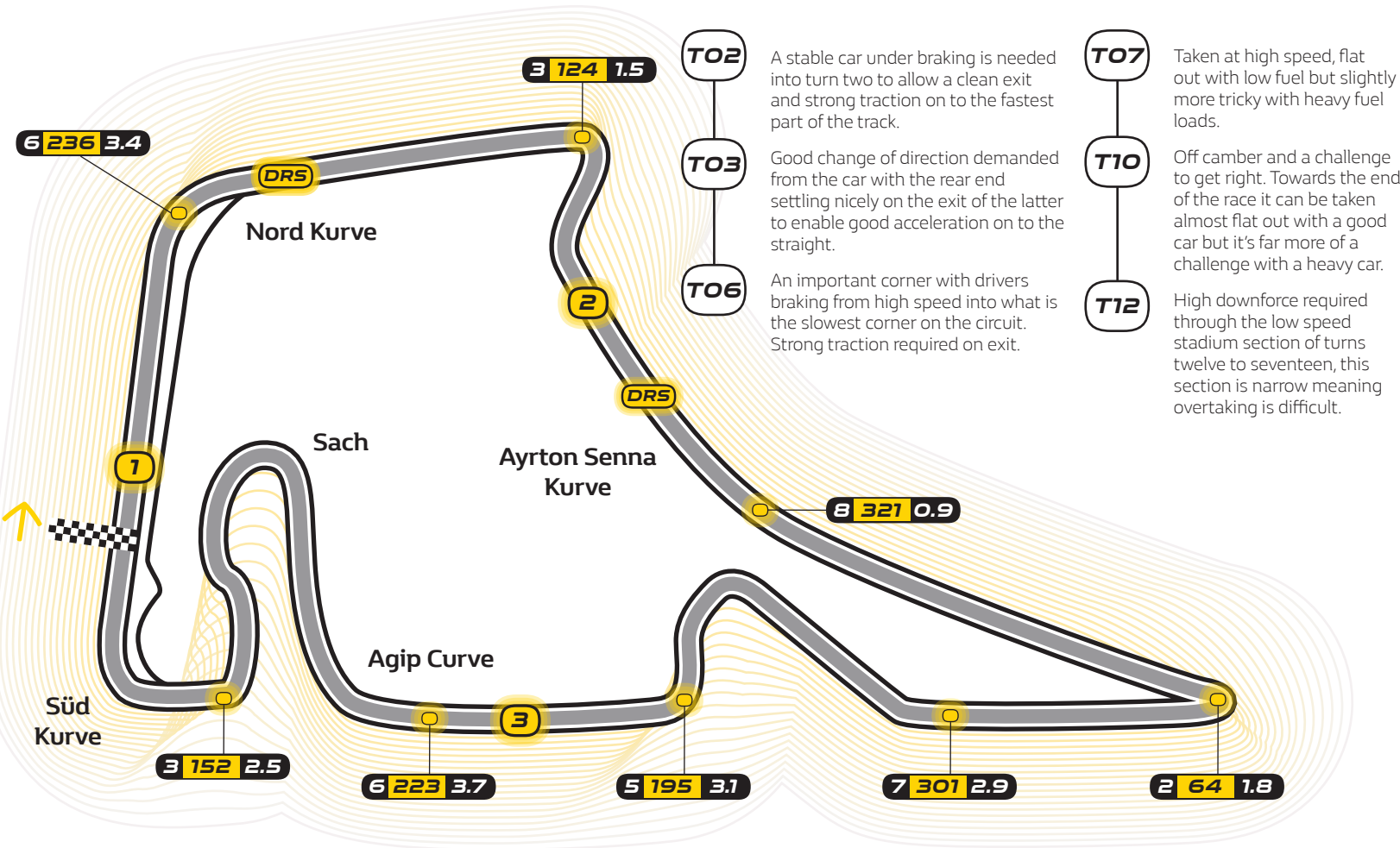


GERMAN FACTS

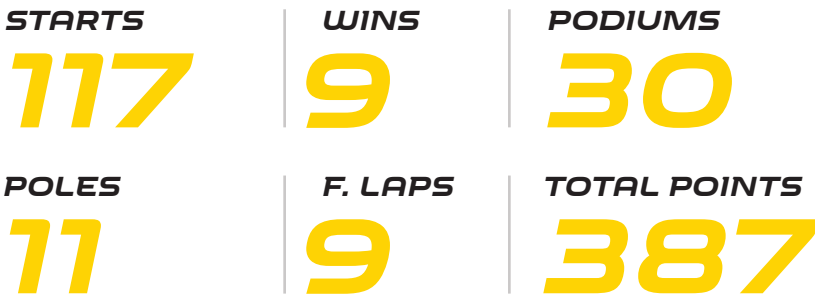
